TEXT D — STORM IN A TEACUP

Communicative Purpose

Controversial Argument – communicate to students through a speech.

Register and Style

The register should be in the range of semi-formal to informal.

Language accuracy is not formally assessed here and should be considered only where mistakes obscure meaning.

Message

The aim is to write the text of a talk to be delivered to fellow students on why the Teacup dog trend is a form of animal cruelty. The talk should focus on the negative points of the Teacup dog trend. The student's feelings of negativity towards the teacup dog trend should be clearly conveyed and the arguments expressed should be convincing. The descriptors regarding copying from the text should be strictly adhered to. Verbatim copying of short sections of the text does NOT constitute "undue copying"; the copying of any section (whether it be long or short) without using it appropriately and incorporating it sensibly into the response will constitute undue copying.

The candidate should include some of the following details from the text:

- (According to animal cruelty activists,) this strange trend has gone too far.
- Producing a Teacup dog is a disturbing process/ “... take two runts ... breed them together”
- Breeding causes these dogs to be unhealthy creatures.
- “They are usually frail (you will have to deal with endless medical bills”).
- Many Teacup dogs are prone to (genetic) diseases/such as water on the brain, heart problems, knee problems and dental disease.
- Such medical problems cause Teacup dogs to have a shorter life span.
- Because of their genetics, Teacup dogs are usually neurotic/disobedient/mean tempered.
- (The SPCA said that) “dogs should be walked and not carried around everywhere so their limbs will be strong and healthy”.
- When dogs are raised above waist height for a long period, they get an over-inflated ego.
- Once they get too big, they could be abandoned or given away.

Criterion B:

To achieve level 5 (adequate understanding) **at least four** details should be included.

To achieve level 9 (very good understanding) **at least seven** details should be included.
